WOOD STREET GALLERIES 601 WOOD STREET

Wood Street Galleries features contemporary art exhibitions focused on technology and its developments through film, video, robotics, and new media installation. Spanning two floors above **Pittsburgh Regional Transit's Wood Street T-station**, the galleries often showcase interactive and immersive art by international artists.

SPACE 812 LIBERTY AVENUE

SPACE is home to exhibitions by regional artists focused on conversations in the contemporary art field and the experience of creating work in the 21st century. The popular street-level gallery is located on bustling Liberty Avenue, steps away from other galleries, restaurants, and Cultural District attractions. **SPACE** is also home to the annual **Juried Visual Art Exhibition**—a featured event of the **Dollar Bank Three Rivers Art Festival**.

707 GALLERY 707 PENN AVENUE

707 Penn Gallery features solo and two-person contemporary art exhibitions by regional artists. The gallery, located across Penn Avenue from the Benedum Center for the Performing Arts in the heart of the Cultural District, often features new work and offers an intimate viewing experience for visitors.

820 GALLERY 820 LIBERTY AVENUE

820 Liberty Gallery features new curatorial and artistic voices in exhibitions throughout the year. Located two doors down from **SPACE**, the gallery's events are produced in partnership with community leaders and neighborhood organizations from throughout the Pittsburgh region.

937 GALLERY 937 LIBERTY AVENUE

937 Liberty Gallery hosts contemporary exhibitions featuring groups of regional, national, and international artists. Exhibitions explore timely societal conversations. The newly renovated gallery space is on the second floor of a multi-purpose arts venue.
